5. THE BOOKIE REPORT

Week 5: The Best of DC Capital

Last Week: 9-2; Season: 34-30 (53%)

Last week **iB** became the first team in DC Capital history to eclipse the 100 run mark. This begs the question at the end of the season where this team might fit amongst the all time best in DC Capital History if they can keep it up. What about **GFYOITP**, which owns the tie-breaker for first heading into the All Star Game? This question then made me realize that in all the years of writing the GMOT we have never done a list of the best teams in Capital Division History.

What better week than All Star Week, when we celebrate the best of Capital, to put out such a list? Scouring old GMOT's, various kickball websites, and my 10 years in the division I managed to put together the Definitive List. Like other lists this one can be scrutinized and debated, but that's why we do them in the first place. In putting it together I had to take into consideration the evolution of the game. Back in 2002 bunting was unheard of and usually the two most unathletic players were lining up at pitcher and catcher. Since then the game and how it is played has greatly evolved, which is why some of the old timers may feel there is a biased towards teams from more recent years. So that being said let's get to it:

Not All Teams are good enough to make the list. Some come up a little short on Super Saturday and for others there is only so much room in the top 7.

Honorable Mentions:

Keg Kickers 2006: You know this list has talent when one of the honorable mentions did nothing other than come out on top with a 13-0 record, the Capital Cup, the Flipcup Tournament, and the Crystal Pitcher

Dropkicker United 2004: Week 1 featured a rematch of the 2003 Capital Cup Final in which DU lost to My Left Foot 6-1. After that all they did was win including the most shocking upset in Capital Cup Finals history when they beat the defending Founders Cup Champion 6 to 5. That year they went on to be the Founder's Cup Runner Up.

No Whammies 2002: This team makes the list only because it is entirely possible they sand bagged the whole season to get the 16 seed. Once they had it in place they knocked off the top seeded Keg Kickers en route to a Capital Cup.

Caisson Steel Erectors 2005: At the time dominant pitchers were a staple of any good team this team employed the strategy of having a female pitcher throw a bouncy ball over the plate and let the defense handle the rest. They finished with an 8-1 record in arguably the toughest year in Capital and were one controversial play away from giving My Left Foot the only blemish on their record that year.

Keg Kickers 2007: The Keg Kickers continued their year and a half winning streak from 2006 and came out on top with one loss in the regular season to Balls of Glory, which they avenged that season in the Capital Cup finals which resulted in the first and only team ever in Capital Division History to win back to back titles.

Now for the best 7 teams in DC Capital History:

7. **Keg Kickers 2008:** This team continued a win streak nearly three years in the making up until the Capital Cup. Along the way they beat down their opponents and looked to be unstoppable until they met the young bunch of upstarts who took the #6 spot.
6. **Ballers and Shot Callers 2008:** Somebody forgot to tell this rookie team that the Keg Kickers were going to three-peat. After going undefeated in the regular season they beat the two-time defending champs on a close play at third base that lead to the only run in the game. For many of their players it would be the first of many trips to the Founders Cup Tournament
5. **My Left Foot 2004:** This is where the debate can begin because this team actually lost the Capital Cup in an upset versus the previous year's runner-up. However the defending Founders Cup Champions did beat everybody else prior to that game, but were then robbed by the Founders Cup Selection Committee who decided they did not merit a wild card bid to the 2004 Tournament.
4. **My Left Foot 2003:** DC Capital went through a major overhaul in strategy starting in 2003 and MLF was at the forefront of it. The team only had one loss during the entire season to the team that finished #2. The reason they are at #4 is because they went undefeated in their run to a Founders Cup including handing out a 17 to 3 beat-down in the Championship Game.
3. **The Other Shot Callers 2010:** OSC was made up of merger of the 2009 Capital Cup Finalist. They managed to steam roll most of the way through the season without any close games and captured the Capital Cup on a rainy Saturday. After that it was off to Vegas where they lost a nail biter in the Founders Cup Finals.
2. **My Left Foot 2005:** This team was a juggernaut bent on revenge after being left out of the 2004 Founders Cup. They allowed only four runs during the entire Capital Division Season, which included a 10 to 0 demolition of the defending Capital Cup Champs in Week 1. They took that momentum all

the way to the WAKA Championship where they put an end to Kick Asphalt's 94 game winning streak to win it all.

1. **The Others 2009:** Los Otros was an All-Star squad made up of players from DC's top teams. They went undefeated throughout the regular season scoring 86 runs while only allowing 3. They knocked off the defending Capital Cup Champs in the finals 3 to 2. From there it was on to Vegas where they achieved the goal they were founded on, bringing the Founders Cup back to DC.

So there you have it, the 7 seven best from the first 13 seasons of DC Capital. Interesting enough the recent teams that made the list are all related. For instance the Ballers and Shot Callers team that beat the Keg Kickers in 2008 saw many of those same faces in 2009 when they played the Others. A year later BSC merged with the Others to form OSC. OSC went their separate ways in Capital and parts of their line up are now on iB and GFYITP. iB also has members of the Caissons, My Left Foot, and Keg Kickers teams mentioned above. Even as the years pass it is still tough to get away from tradition in Capital.

6. WHAT IS THE ALL-STAR GAME?

The All-Star game is a 6 inning exhibition game designed to allow Wednesday and Thursday nights to interact with each other in a fun festive atmosphere. Really – It's a reason to come play kickball on a week we would have gotten a bye week because many people leave for the week due to Memorial Day. While both teams want to win bragging rights, at the end of the day, the goal is to make new friends on the Fields of Glory.

7. HISTORY OF THE ALL-STAR GAME

So this is the ninth year of the All Star Game so we figured we would give you a recap of the previous year's courtesy of the Bookie.

** Our apologies to the Federal teams who may feel left out of this. We did our research and could not find any records of a DC Federal All-Star team.*

2002 : This was the first All Star Game ever and it was a tournament among the four big DC Divisions. The tournament culminated in one of the finest moments in Capital History. After a 6-4 victory over Adams Morgan, Capital took on Potomac. A 3-0 shutout by Potomac was broken up with 2 outs in the bottom of the 5th on a chaotic grand slam that involved a huge crash between a runner and a third basemen and a play at the plate as Capital took it home 4-3.

2003: No drama this year as the Capital Division destroyed their opponents by double digit margins in both rounds. The Dream Team defeated the all stars from the Potomac Division 25-1 in the first round of the tournament, then defeated the Adams Morgan all stars 18-3 to take the title.

2004: Just like 2003 it got ugly quick before the game was called in the first round. The second round wasn't much different. Capital 13 – Constitution 1; Capital 8 – Potomac 3. Capital Division was now 6-0 in All Star Tournaments.

2005: DC Capital was about to get a major facelift in the off-season. 12 of 16 teams departed the division following the Capital Cup and no All Star Game was held. In an interesting side note the four remaining teams made up the final four the following year. Two of the teams then retired from Capital.

2006: The All Star Game came back as a simpler version of Wednesday vs. Thursday in an effort to end the age old question of who is better. Thursday was a huge underdog, but only lost by one run in the new Mid-Summer classic. WNAS 2 – TNAS 1.

2007: The All Star Game was a battle back and forth and after the regulation 7 innings there was a tie. Two more innings were added to find a champion, but it wasn't enough. With daylight fading and their livers pleading Captains Brendan Walsh and Ryan Bolchoz called it a tie and took it to the bar. WNAS 3 – TNAS 3

2008: Leading up to All-Star week 2008, too much hype was given to the fact that Wednesday was stacked with returners. Thursday's rookies took offense to all of the hype and took a commanding 7-0 lead. It took 3 innings, but Wednesday rallied to come back to make it 7-5. Thursday, not to be out done, came back with a rally of their own. During the 6th inning, a base-path collision sent tensions boiling over the top. Before it got out of hand the game was called and the 6th inning erased. TNAS 10 WNAS 5.

2009: The day started out with the Wednesday Night Captain stepping down. The game started out by a Wednesday Night All Star running out to the field and turning around to yell "Where's Right Centerfield y'all?" Last Minute Replacement Captain Mike Grinnell yelled back "Go to centerfield and take a right" to the clueless belle and then sunk his head with the understanding of the beat down they were about to receive. Thursday officially took a one game lead in the standings with an 11 to 0 shellacking.

2010: The division expanded to become a 22 team super-league. Wednesday Captain Andy Festa and Thursday Captain Paul Duncan faced off, culminating in another dominating performance by the Thursday All-Stars. A 9-0 victory ensured that Wednesday's dry-spell of scoring would last another year.

2011: DC Capital and DC Federal joined forces for the season. Rather than split the All-Stars between Wednesday and Thursdays, Captains Zach Gray and Andy Festa got to draft their All-Star teams from the 22 available teams. Will Zach continue Thursday's legacy of total domination? Will Andy get his first All-Star win as Captain? We'll find out on Thursday...

Fastest Man / Woman Competition

The Fastest Man / Woman begins at 6:30. It will run concurrently with the All-Star game. Those participating in both events should let the organizers know so they can make sure you are not scheduled in both places at the same time.

Each team may select at one or more male or female players to represent them. Runners will start off with bunting a ball already on home plate and running through 1st base. The second heat is bunting a ball and running around the bases. The Winner will be the fastest average time from Home Plate to 1st base and from Home plate around the bases back to home.

Home-run Derby

The Home-run Derby begins at 6:30. It will run concurrently with the All-Star game. Those participating in both events should let the organizers know so they can make sure you are not scheduled in both places at the same time.

Each team may select a person (male or female) to represent them. A regulation field will be set up with an additional row of cones that is located 100 feet from home plate. Each player can choose their own pitcher. They will be able to kick 5 pitches, and only allowed a max of three bad pitches/kicks. (No more than 8 pitches per kicker). Each ball that clears the 100 foot cone in the air is awarded one point. The three players with the most points advance to the finals. In case of a tie, it goes to a kickoff. Each player involved in the tie can kick one ball that is pitched by a player of their choice. The player that kicks it the farthest advances to the finals.

12. HAN SOLO CUP TOURNAMENT

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Five Person teams. No more; No Less.
2. Teams must be Co-ed.
3. No backboards allowed during official games. Pitchers will be placed on the floor (or somewhere else besides the table) during game play. Used cups from previous matches will be thrown out. The table must be clear of everything except the player's own cup.
4. Each member of the team must be registered to play kickball this season on your team.
5. Each table will come with a Ref. They are wearing an Orange All-Star shirt. Do not start the game without a ref.
6. Teams will play best of 5 games; first to 3 is the winner; Championship Round will be best of 9 game; first to 5.
7. No substitutions
8. The division will provide free beer.
9. Fill to the first line of the cup (aka, at LEAST ½ inch of drink shall be in the cup)
10. Ties can only be called by the Ref. Tie-breakers follow the same flip-off rules as the normal post-game matches.
11. Refs will report scores to the Score keeper.
12. For all rules not mentioned above, see the Han Solo Cup rules for our normal post-game matches
13. Good luck, have fun, and may the best team win

(New rule from last year) The higher seeded team gets to choose what side of the table they play from.

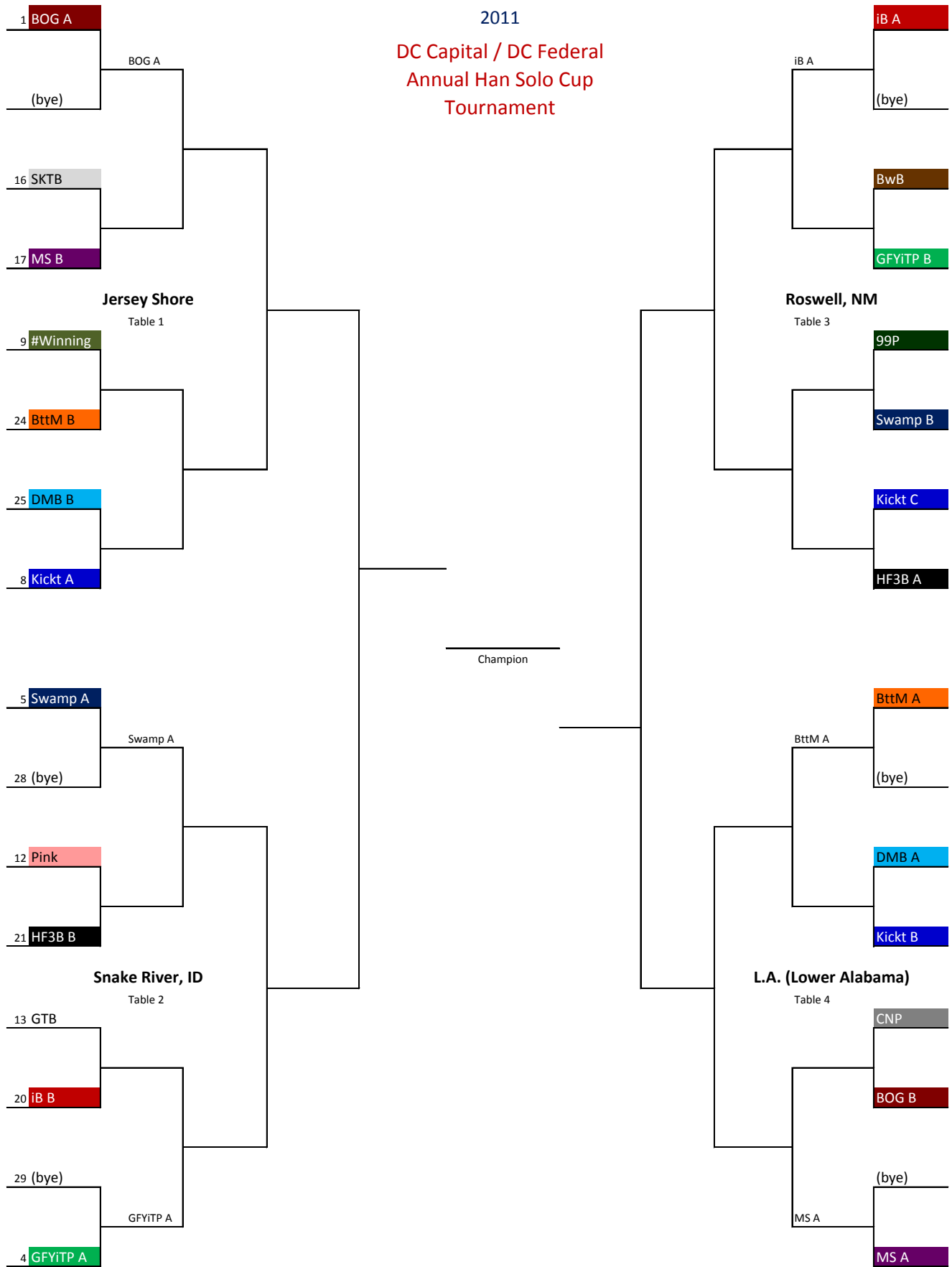
